

**Record of Proceedings – August 26, 2019**  
**Washington Township Trustees, Warren County, Ohio**

The regular meeting was held with Fisher and Hagemeyer present. We opened the meeting by inviting all to join in the Pledge of Allegiance. Receipts of \$5,304.34 since our last meeting were reported and filed for audit. Warrants 10854 through 10866 and Vouchers 39, 40 and 41-2019 totaling \$7,281.10 were presented for approval. Hagemeyer made motion, seconded by Fisher to pay bills as presented. Motion carried. Minutes from the previous meeting were approved as presented.

**FROM THE FLOOR:**

Report on burned-out house at 166 Clarksville Road: Health Department has condemned. One of the daughters has paid some of the back taxes and made arrangements to continue payments. Property is not yet in probate court. As some of the taxes were paid, the foreclosure process is now halted. A trailer will not be permitted after demolition, according to zoning department.

**ROADS REPORT:**

From our Roads Supervisor, Allen Stanforth:

- Ford truck is at Lebanon Ford for brake rebuild
- Chip/seal and paving contractors are held up due to rain

**UNFINISHED BUSINESS:**

- Reminder of Open House for the new classroom and burn tower at the Clinton-Warren Joint Fire District on August 31 at 1pm
- Warren County Engineer's Office attempted to get a grant from the Ohio Public Works Commission to help with repair of Mather's Mill (Wilmington Road) hill. There are not enough emergency funds in the state fund, and repair is still on hold
- Complaints were made about the condition of front yard at 1070 Ward-Koebel Road. Trustees decided to send a friendly reminder to resident to please remedy

**NEW BUSINESS:**

- Ohio History Connection representatives and Jack Blosser of Ft. Ancient met with Hagemeyer August 19 to give trustees an update on the World Heritage Site process. The U.S. has one new World Heritage Site, comprised of eight sites. Ft. Ancient and other similar sites are next in line for the U.S., and will probably be accepted in 2023. The OHC is looking to get a grant to purchase 56 acres of King's Domain that adjoins Ft. Ancient. They requested the trustees to pass a resolution supporting their application for a grant to make that purchase. Fisher made motion, seconded by Hagemeyer to do so. Motion carried.
- Warren County Thoroughfare Plan was amended
- AEP Ohio is upgrading power lines between Hillsboro and Blanchester and between Blanchester and Lebanon. Washington Township is not affected.

As there was no further business, Hagemeyer made motion, seconded by Fisher to adjourn. Motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 8:50pm.
