

Record of Proceedings – August 8, 2016
Washington Township Trustees, Warren County, Ohio

The regular meeting was held with Williams and Hagemeyer present. President Williams opened the meeting and we recited the Pledge of Allegiance. Minutes from the last meeting were read and approved. Receipts of \$0 since our last meeting were reported and were filed for audit. Warrants 10036-10044 totaling \$8,618.19 were presented for approval. Hagemeyer made motion, seconded by Williams to pay bills as presented. Motion carried.

FROM THE FLOOR:

- Salem/Morrow Fire Chief Bill Harrison attended to give us a report for June activities. There were 29 fire/rescue calls, 53 emergency medical service calls, and 7 motor vehicle crashes. Busiest day of the month was Monday. They do training and testing every month; special training this month included grain bin and water rescue training.
- School will be starting soon – many people are driving too fast, especially with the Wilmington Road detour ongoing. Caution is urged.
- 702 Middleboro Road continues to be an eyesore. Doney will inquire of the Prosecutor's office.

ROADS REPORT:

From our Roads Supervisor, Allen Stanforth:

Letter was sent to Lisle Lane resident with a raised lip on his concrete driveway. It was signed for and received. Lip should never be higher than roadway due to plowing, and resident accepts responsibility for any damage to plow.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

- Little River Café received our letter and replied. They understand the neighbors' concerns and have instructed their employees accordingly. They will be trying some sound absorption curtains for the west side of the porch, and committed to low volume after 10pm. They hope to be good neighbors going forward.
- Warren County Engineer's Office wishes us to accept Lisle Lane for township maintenance. As our letter of concern was received by the resident, Hagemeyer made motion, seconded by Williams to accept. Motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS:

- Hagemeyer received a call regarding a neighbor's property on Settlemyre Road that has overgrown thistle. The neighbor does mow, but not his entire yard. Hagemeyer spoke to the owner about the noxious weeds, and the neighbor seemed responsive.
- Ohio Department of Transportation requested the Trustees sign a resolution approving of State Bike Route 21 (current route along the river) in support of the American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials (AASHTO). Hagemeyer made motion to sign resolution, seconded by Williams. Motion carried.

As there was no further business, Hagemeyer made motion, seconded by Williams to adjourn. Motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 8:43pm.
