

Record of Proceedings – December 22, 2014
Washington Township Trustees, Warren County, Ohio

The regular meeting was held with Schaefer, Hagemeyer and Williams present. President Schaefer opened the meeting. All joined in the Pledge of Allegiance. Minutes from the last meeting were read and approved. Receipts of \$6,998.15 since our last meeting were reported and were filed for audit. Warrants 9602-9614 and Vouchers 45-2014 and 46-2014 totaling \$10,230.44 were presented for approval.

FROM THE FLOOR:

- Lt. Miller of the Sheriff's office was in attendance. He reported that burglaries are down from last year. He handed out a flyer about the ten-week Sheriff's Office Citizens' Academy that begins on March 12 and teaches about patrol functions, jail operations, incident case studies, cold cases, detective function, crimes, Drug Task Force, K-9s and more. - Resident on Fordyce Road having issues with mail carrier. She is not pleased that the township installed a "No Parking" sign in her cul-de-sac, stating that her household never parks there. Trustees informed her that others had and that it is important to keep the turn-around clear for emergency vehicles and the mail carrier as it is part of the official right-of-way.
- Warren County Zoning Board of Appeals is considering the appeal from David and Stephanie Brausch and will publish an opinion on January 13.

ROADS REPORT:

From our Roads Supervisor, Allen Stanforth:

- New truck has been received. Will calibrate salt spreader this week.
- Singleton Trucking will haul salt for us.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

If Ft. Ancient is declared a World Heritage Site, visitors could increase by twenty-fold in the first year. Current visitors number approximately 26,000 per year. Warren County Regional Planning Commission asks that we send a letter asking them to help plan for the potential growth. Topic tabled for now. NEW BUSINESS:

- Williams gave an end-of-year report for the Clinton-Warren Fire District. They responded to 200 fire calls and 450 emergency medical service (EMS) calls in 2014. The Chief should receive his vehicle in January. Denny will serve a second year in 2015 on the Fire Board.
- Our Roads Supervisor will plow the fire station lot in 2015. Several local entities take turns.

As there was no further business, Hagemeyer made motion, seconded by Willaims to adjourn. Motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 7:45pm.
