

Record of Proceedings – June 9, 2014

Washington Township Trustees, Warren County, Ohio

The regular meeting was held with Williams, Hagemeyer and Schaefer present. President Schaefer opened the meeting. All joined in the Pledge of Allegiance. Minutes from the last meeting were read and approved. Receipts of \$19,631.98 since our last meeting were reported and were filed for audit. Warrants 9460 through 9470 totaling \$11,986.87 were presented for approval.

FROM THE FLOOR:

- The new Superintendent of Clinton-Massie Schools, Dr. David Baits attended to introduce himself and pose a couple questions regarding snow plowing procedures in the township. It takes about 5 ½ hours during a heavy snow event to make the rounds of all the township roads. Mr. Baits will be in touch with our Roads Supervisor as needed. We have had good communication with the C-M Bus Supervisor in the past.
- David Brausch, owner of the composting facility on Gum Grove Road, attended. He said that a Site Plan is complete and is handed in to the county with a request for a Planned Unit Development (PUD) to allow his business to be in compliance with Zoning. He does have the needed EPA licenses. There will eventually be a public hearing regarding the PUD.
- Lt. Miller of the Sheriff's Office attended. Now that school is out, there have been some reports of small vandalisms and thefts.

ROADS REPORT:

From our Roads Supervisor, Allen Stanforth:

- Allen met with Jason Fisher of Warren County Engineer's Office and property owner Bonnie Mercuri regarding the proposed plan for a hammerhead at the dead end of Strout Road at Fisher Road. The proposed plan will not work; we will have to go off of our right-of-way and use part of her private property. Planning will continue, and the owner is in agreement.
- Crack sealing around the township has gone well; will be out of crack seal material tomorrow.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

Certified letter failed to reach owners of 8921 Arrowcreek to inform them of their weeds nuisance. We found another local address in Lebanon that we will try before continuing with our process.

NEW BUSINESS:

- Congressman Chabot's office called and asked if he could meet with people in the township in the near future. Hagemeyer will find out details and report back.
- Frontier DSL is now available in parts of the township. It runs along Ward-Koebel Road, Arrowcreek Drive, Blazing Trail, Wilmington Road from Ward-Koebel to Route 380, and more. Contact number is 888-772-3501 or visit www.frontier.com. This is in addition to other parts of the township that are served by CenturyLink DSL. Otherwise, air cards and satellite are being used for internet access.
- Due to the Affordable Care Act, our health care premium reimbursement policy will change. We are in compliance with the Ohio Revised Code, but the federal guidelines supersede the ORC. In order to be in compliance with the ACA, the reimbursements will have to be treated as a bonus and be included as income on our W-2s.

As there was no further business, Williams made motion, seconded by Hagemeyer, to adjourn. Motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 8:37pm.
