

## **Record of Proceedings – March 28, 2016**

### **Washington Township Trustees, Warren County, Ohio**

The regular meeting was held with Hagemeyer, Schaefer and Williams present. President Williams opened the meeting and we recited the Pledge of Allegiance. Minutes from the last meeting were read and approved. Receipts of \$7,473.21 since our last meeting were reported and were filed for audit. Warrants 9937-9951 and Vouchers 11-2016 and 12-2016 were presented for approval. Schaefer made motion, seconded by Hagemeyer, to pay bills as presented. Motion carried.

#### FROM THE FLOOR:

1. Sheriff Larry Sims attended to present his 2015 Year in Review report. The Sheriff's office received over 69,000 calls for service in 2015. 3000 Concealed Carry permits were issued, although some were renewals. 2. Major Steve Arrasmith of the Drug Task Force presented an Annual Report for the DTF. There were 356 criminal investigations for drug trafficking, 60 overdoses. Average jail occupancy is 279 out of 280 slots. He did point out that unwanted prescription drugs can be dropped off 24 hours a day at the Sheriff's office jail lobby at 822 Memorial Drive. 3. Residents on Arrowhead Lane were concerned about some deep cracks in their road. These have been filled very deeply and then eventually they reappear. Allen will research these transverse cracks and see if there isn't a more permanent solution.
4. Another resident of Arrowhead Lane reported excess grits after last year's chip seal program. As stated in prior meetings, the trustees were dissatisfied with the quality of the sweeping after last year's application. Our road supervisor has been blowing the grits out of yards and driveways and picking up large amounts.
5. A resident on Indian Lakes Blvd. also brought up the excess grits on the roadway. We are continuing to clean up the excess grits and will keep abreast of the situation.

#### ROADS REPORT:

From our Roads Supervisor, Allen Stanforth:

Warren County Engineer's Office is asking for a resolution in order to participate in their 2016 salt program. Motion was made and seconded to request 200 tons for the next snow season. Resolution was signed and will be sent in to the engineer.

#### UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

- We can junk or give away the old sirens that were free to us. They were not capable of broadcasting very far and are not worth much.
- Resident of Strout Road pointed out a large drop-off. Allen inspected and will add some large rock to build it up.

#### NEW BUSINESS:

Fiscal Officer Doney begins her new four year term on April 1, 2016. Trustee Williams issued the Oath of Office.

As there was no further business, Hagemeyer made motion, seconded by Schaefer to adjourn. Motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 9:12pm.
