

Record of Proceedings – November 28, 2016

Washington Township Trustees, Warren County, Ohio

The regular meeting was held with Williams, Schaefer and Hagemeyer present. President Williams opened the meeting and we recited the Pledge of Allegiance. Minutes from the last meeting were read and approved. Receipts of \$7,543.30 since our last meeting were reported and were filed for audit. Warrants 10114-10128 and Vouchers 47, 48 and 49-2016 totaling \$8,392.25 were presented for approval. Schaefer made motion, seconded by Hagemeyer to pay bills as presented. Motion carried.

FROM THE FLOOR:

Nothing at this time.

ROADS REPORT:

From our Roads Supervisor, Allen Stanforth:

- Ohio Department of Transportation has asked if we have any changes in our road mileage in 2016. We repaved Ross Road and added one foot of width, and accepted Lisle Lane for township maintenance at a mileage of .303 mile. This brings us to 21.476 total miles in the township.
- On our paving contract arranged through the county this year, we were overcharged \$12,000. As the bills were already approved by the commissioners, the county will cover our first \$12,000 in paving or chip/seal expenses next year. Allen was on site the day of paving, and realized that the numbers were incorrect.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

- We had inquired of the county engineer how to handle snow removal in Meurer Estates. This subdivision is not yet approved for township maintenance. The engineer's office indicated that it might be difficult to pursue a snow clearing agreement with the owners of the development due to an auction and a court case. It was decided at this time that we would plow in the event of a major snowfall.
- We have received a draft noise ordinance from the prosecutor's office. Adam Nice would like to attend a meeting with the sheriff and present all angles of this topic. We will suggest the second meeting in January or either of the February meetings.

NEW BUSINESS:

- Second hearing on accessory buildings, structure standards and farm-based tourism will be held November 29 at 9am in the commissioners' meeting room.
- Hagemeyer received a call regarding open burning at 232 Corwin Road. Truckloads of material were being brought in and burned in a concrete structure. Resident called Sheriff's department, who called the Health department, and Zoning was also notified.

As there was no further business, Schaefer made motion, seconded by Hagemeyer to adjourn. Motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 7:15pm.
