

Record of Proceedings – October 24, 2016

Washington Township Trustees, Warren County, Ohio

The regular meeting was held with Williams, Schaefer and Hagemeyer present. President Williams opened the meeting and we recited the Pledge of Allegiance. Minutes from the last meeting were read and approved. Receipts of \$7,473.94 since our last meeting were reported and were filed for audit. Warrants 10092-10103 and Vouchers 42, 43 and 44-2016 totaling \$8,191.33 were presented for approval. Hagemeyer made motion, seconded by Schaefer to pay bills as presented. Motion carried.

FROM THE FLOOR:

- New resident on Ward-Koebel attended and was welcomed.
- Resident wondered if noise control ordinance has been returned from the Prosecutor's office. It is currently being reviewed.
- A resident on Lisle Lane remarked that a "Curve Ahead" sign would be nice on Settlemyre Road at the large curve. Roads Supervisor will evaluate.

ROADS REPORT:

From our Roads Supervisor, Allen Stanforth:

- Allen was contacted by Warren County Emergency Services about a tree down on Corwin Road and Olive Branch Roads, which are county roads. It seems that our prior letter is not being followed. The issue is that if Allen doesn't reply immediately, Wayne Township Fire Department will be called out, and the township will be needlessly charged. We will send another letter to that department asking them to train their personnel.
- Resident on Lincoln Road complained about the boom mowing of trees on their road. It is permitted if limbs are overhanging the right-of-way. These were large as the owner had previously requested that we leave the trees alone. We complied at the time, although the roadway surface stays healthier without shade. The resident withdrew his objection and asked that we forge ahead at this time. Of course it will cover over in the spring, and most of the waste will be chopped up.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

- Next meeting of the I71/Wilmington Road Citizen's Advisory Committee will be November 3 at Olive Branch United Methodist Church at 6:30pm. Public is welcome.
- Report on 702 Middleboro Road: owners have not cleared up anything in the yard, in fact, it has become worse. Prosecutor's Office is filing a suit. Whole process could take up to a year.

NEW BUSINESS:

- Time will fall back on November 5; our next meeting on November 14 will therefore be at 7pm.
- Election Day will be Tuesday, November 8, and the polls will be open from 6:30am-7:30pm.

As there was no further business, Schaefer made motion, seconded by Hagemeyer to adjourn. Motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 8:18pm.
