

Record of Proceedings – October 8, 2018
Washington Township Trustees, Warren County, Ohio

The regular meeting was held with Hagemeyer, Fisher and Schaefer present. President Hagemeyer opened the meeting by inviting all to join in the Pledge of Allegiance. Receipts of \$0 since our last meeting were reported and filed for audit. Warrants 10629-10635 totaling \$10,245.30 were presented for approval. Schaefer made motion, seconded by Fisher to pay bills as presented. Motion carried. Minutes from the previous meeting were approved as presented.
