

Record of Proceedings – October 13, 2014
Washington Township Trustees, Warren County, Ohio

The regular meeting was held with Williams, Hagemeyer and Schaefer present. President Schaefer opened the meeting. All joined in the Pledge of Allegiance. Minutes from the last meeting were read and approved. Receipts of \$8,417.92 since our last meeting were reported and were filed for audit. Warrants 9552-9559 totaling \$5,841.24 were presented for approval.

FROM THE FLOOR:

- Sealed bids for our 2007 International Truck were opened. Winning bid went to Woodville Township of Sandusky County for \$55,000. They will pick up Thursday or Friday.
- Clinton-Massie Superintendent attended to inform us of upcoming Permanent Improvement Levy that will be on the ballot on November 4. It would be collected over a five year period for permanent improvements such as buses, facilities repair, etc. Taxes per \$100,000 in value would equal \$140/year. He stated that we have gone 26 years without an increase in their operating levy.

ROADS REPORT:

From our Roads Supervisor, Allen Stanforth:

Salt topic was discussed. County Engineer has been researching availability other companies. Chemical Equipment Labs offered salt at \$100 per ton. We would have to have it trucked from the river. Allen feels we could get by with 150 tons. We will research type of salt that is being offered. A contract was finally received from Morton Salt dated October 6 at an offered price of \$136 per ton. We will gather more information and make a decision at our next meeting.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

- Dinner at the Clinton-Warren Joint Fire District went well – approximately 300 people attended, and net profit was \$2200. The Fire Board voted to get a vehicle for the chief.
- Congressman Chabot held a town hall meeting on September 29 – he was here approximately one hour, and visited with a few residents.
- Dedication on October 3 at Camp Joy of the Rachael A. Hutzler Observatory was very well attended.
- Report of low-flying aircraft was an airplane spraying cover crop seeds.
- Brausch PUD request was denied by the Warren County Commissioners.

NEW BUSINESS:

None at this time.

As there was no further business, Hagemeyer made motion, seconded by Williams, to adjourn. Motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 8:50pm.
