

# Record of Proceedings – April 12, 2010

## Washington Township Trustees, Warren County, Ohio

The regular meeting was held with Hagemeyer, Schaefer and Williams present. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. President Williams called the meeting to order. Minutes from the last meeting were read and approved. Receipts of \$5119.18 since our last meeting were reported and were filed for audit. Warrants 8130 thru 8139 totaling \$4733.30 were presented for approval.

### FROM THE FLOOR:

- Resident Susan Case gave a synopsis of the cemetery restoration clinic held on April 10<sup>th</sup>. It was very well-organized and useful in learning how to clean and repair headstones. Thanks to the township for sending two representatives. The manual from the clinic will stay on file at the township hall. The Genealogical Society welcomes volunteers in this endeavor.
- Speeding is still an issue on Ward-Koebel Road.

### ROADS REPORT:

From our Roads Supervisor, Liston Burton:

- Liston plowed and salted approximately 2.5 miles of subdivision roads this winter that are not yet accepted by the township for maintenance. Total cost to the township is \$19,200. We will bill the four builders for these costs. Warren County Engineer's Office has pledged to reimburse us for the salt used on these unaccepted roads by giving us a commensurate amount of salt before next season.
- Liston will need a load of cold patch to begin patching winter damage.

### UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

- iFiber has paperwork in place to use the county tower near I-71; owner is getting start-up dollars ready. Martin Russell of the Warren County Economic Development Office has been very helpful in this process.
- Reminder from the Trustees to fill out and mail census forms.
- Collett's Propane price (small amount that we use at township hall) is more expensive than Southwest Landmark, but once we would add in tank rental costs from Landmark, Collett's is still cheaper per year.
- Schaefer reported on Fire Board meeting; everything is on even keel for now. Budget constraints may be forthcoming.

### NEW BUSINESS:

- Primary will be held on May 4<sup>th</sup>; statewide issues are available for review on the Secretary of State's website at <http://www.sos.state.oh.us/SOS/publications/electVoterPubs/issues.aspx>
- Hagemeyer reported that he rounded up two loose horses this morning; contact him if you are missing any.
- County Engineer has alerted Trustees that Fellowship of Praise Church with a driveway off of Route 22/3 would like to add a drive off of Strout Road.
- Warren County Township Association will meet April 24 at 9am the Lebanon Bob Evans.
- Warren County Community Services announces a forum on Tuesday May 4<sup>th</sup> from 9:30-11:30am at the 741 Center. It is ***Moving Forward: Seniors, Transportation and Independence***. The purpose is to share transportation opinions and concerns, and participants will learn about transportation options in the county.
- OTARMA online safety videos available to elected officials and employees.
- Zoning violation on Bob Short Street.
- Difficulty accessing the Olive Branch Cemetery to mow as the creek bed washes out quite often. Our right-of-way is narrow and will be difficult to correct.
