

Record of Proceedings – April 23, 2012

Washington Township Trustees, Warren County, Ohio

The regular meeting was held with Hagemeyer, Williams and Schaefer present. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited and President Hagemeyer called the meeting to order. Minutes from the last meeting were read and approved. Receipts of \$114,345.56 since our last meeting were reported and were filed for audit. Warrants 8741 thru 8757 plus Voucher 16 totaling \$23,142.98 were presented for approval.

FROM THE FLOOR:

Chris Miller of the Warren County Sheriff's Office attended – will come by at least once a month. He urges residents to keep an eye out for unusual activity in their neighborhoods. ROADS REPORT:

From our Roads Supervisor, Liston Burton:

- Paving has not yet begun in Hopewell Meadows subdivision.
- There will be a pre-build meeting regarding Hopewell Meadows on Tuesday May 8 at 9am at Corwin House. Burton, Stanforth, Hagemeyer and Schaefer will attend.
- Bonnybrook would like to gate Strout Road so that people don't turn-around. After discussion, Trustees agreed that gate would have to be on private property, not in the right-of-way. We could install "No Outlet" signs to help.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

- Clinton-Warren Joint Fire District will hold a special meeting on April 26 to discuss life squad specs. New one will cost approximately \$175,000.
- Warren County Engineer will hold dinner on April 19 to update all on county projects. Burton and Hagemeyer will attend; Doney will RSVP.
- Hagemeyer wondered if we have a sign retroreflectivity policy in place; Doney will research and report back.
- Justin Rich will receive his Eagle Scout Award on April 29 at Clinton-Massie at 3pm. Justin is the scout, along with his troop, who helped with the Olive Branch Cemetery restoration. All are welcome to attend.

NEW BUSINESS:

- 16th Annual Warren County Prayer Breakfast will be held on May 3 at Hope Church in Mason from 7-8:30am.
- First half property taxes were received in the amount of \$104,731. This amount is divided into the General, Road and Bridge, and Special Levy funds as dictated by the county. Last year's first half taxes were \$107,677.
- Bob Hackman and Mr. VanDoren have been volunteering their time at the abandoned Union Cemetery and Church, and it is looking great! Their commitment is appreciated.
- There have been some complaints about volunteer firemen driving recklessly when leaving the Hopewell Meadows subdivision. They must follow the speed limits and not endanger other citizens.

As there was no further business, Schaefer made motion, seconded by Williams, to adjourn. Motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 8:43pm.
