

Record of Proceedings – June 24, 2013

Washington Township Trustees, Warren County, Ohio

The regular meeting was held with Hagemeyer, Schaefer and Williams present. President Williams opened the meeting, and all recited the Pledge of Allegiance. Minutes from the last meeting were read and approved. Receipts of \$5,786.35 since our last meeting were reported and were filed for audit. Warrants 9146 through 9156 and Voucher 18-2013 totaling \$7,252.47 were presented for approval.

FROM THE FLOOR:

A resident wondered if the township has a policy or requires permits for salesmen going door-to-door in the township. The Trustees replied in the negative. Resident may wish to query the county if it becomes a problem.

ROADS REPORT:

From our Roads Supervisor, Allen Stanforth:

- Electrical issues occurring again on the International Truck. Allen will have problem analyzed.
- Half done with crack-sealing. It is going well.
- Couple more ditching projects to handle this summer.
- New tractor and boom mower are running fine.
- Roads Supervisor presented proposed 2014 road projects. They total \$104,500, to include chip-sealing of Lincoln Road, Arrowcreek Drive, Blazing Trail and Sentinel Court. We will also replace guard rail and posts on Strout Road and Gum Grove Road off of Route 132. Trustees were in agreement with the proposed expenses.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

- Property at 8733 Arrowcreek Drive was mowed on June 19, but job is not adequate. Karen will take pictures and let the bank know that the company must do a better job so that the property is not an eyesore.
- Schaefer made motion, seconded by Hagemeyer, to continue to belong to the Warren County Emergency Management Organization. Motion carried.
- Public hearing coming up regarding water/sewer rate increases in the city.
- Hagemeyer drafted a response to the Engineer's office regarding proposed changes to the Subdivision Regulations. We are in general in agreement with the proposed changes, but have serious concerns about applying the final coat of asphalt within a specified time period. This could create durability problems of the road surface when it is the responsibility of the township. All signed the letter of concern and sent it on.
- Hagemeyer spoke with the Wayne Township Fire Chief regarding the home the owner would like to have burned down. The resident was informed of some steps he would have to take before proceeding.

NEW BUSINESS:

At our next meeting on July 8, Doney will present proposed budget for 2014.

As there was no further business, Schaefer made motion, seconded by Hagemeyer, to adjourn. Motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 8:27pm.
