

Record of Proceedings – April 10, 2023
Washington Township Trustees, Warren County, Ohio

The meeting was called to order by President Paul Schaefer at 7:00 PM. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

The minutes of March 27, 2023 were mailed to the Trustees prior to the meeting for review. Warrants 11943 through 11947 totaling \$8,471.77 were presented for approval.

This is a completely free service and they can help with Job matching, On-site interviews, Resume preparation, Training, Labor market information, and also has an attended Resource Room to access internet, use copiers, faxes and phones.

ROADS REPORT: Mr. Stanforth reported:

- The Township garage door spring broke and it will be fixed tomorrow.
- The recent high winds caused some damage on Lincoln Road and on Settlemyre Road a tree went down across the road and took down some power lines. Todd Bailey helped with the clean-up on Sunday.

OLD BUSINESS:

- Mr. Hagemeyer reported that the Warren County Zoning Office received a voicemail from Todd Blackschleger of 7276 Shawhan Ayers Road, Clarksville.
